Ben: What did you do?

Jen: Nothing, really. I just got mad at my Englisg teacher and called her a hay-hookin' old pig.

Ben: What? Where didja ever pick up language like that? They should've skinned the hide off ya'.

Jen: She said I was a savage and should have stayed out West wakk with the Indians.

Ben: She did? You shoul've knocked her teeth in, the hay-hookin' old pig.

Jen: So everything's fine, huh, Pa??

Ben: Not really. People are movin' out. Just about everyone, I guess. No more gold -- we're "busted."

Jen: Everyon's moved out, Pa?

Ben: Yep, just about.

Jen: What about Julio?

Ben: Julio? Yeah, I reckon he's gone, too.
